The course also aims to encourage the students to enhance their critical thinking and reflective abilities as it relates to how montage can be used and how it has been used throughout the years – to convey messages and develop images.</p>

Course content	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Montage as an art and as a central creative process in shaping the narrative of TV broadcasting and programmes. • Pioneers who laid the foundations and marked the evolution of montage. • Premiere software, layout–work space analysis. Image-video analysis, file types and sizes, technical characteristics, editing theory, file import, presentation of basic tools. Examples and practice. • Analysis of image editing tools. Editing techniques. Examples and practice. • Presentation analysis and processing of transitions and effects, Keyframes Animation-timing. Examples and practice. • Colour image processing with colour correction techniques. • Audio customization-editing. Audio waveform analysis and synchronization with video. Examples and practice. • Edit and synchronize titles-subtitles. Theory of export, correlation of data volume and image quality, choice of format and codec depending on the display medium. Examples and practice.
Teaching methodology	<p>Interactive lectures, individual or group exercises aimed at the continuous formative assessment of students, discussions, assignments and practical training in the College's radio and television studio. The course further aims to encourage the students to demonstrate their critical thinking and reflective abilities as they relate to the way montage can be used – and how it has been used throughout the years – to convey messages and build images. The students will be asked to study articles / research in order to be able to form a comprehensive view of the above (see supporting material).</p>
